London-born architect and master builder Thomas Cundy II began his career in his father's office. He eventually took over the practice, together with his Cornish father's role as surveyor to Lord Grosvenor's estates in Belgravia and Pimlico.

One of Thomas Junior's highly respected and much-admired buildings in Belgravia is currently for sale in Lower Belgrave Street. Built in around 1842, the Grade II listed six-storey house overlooking Eaton Square has now been extensively refurbished in a high spec makeover featuring high quality brand names and high tech home comforts.

The property has five upstairs bedrooms, including master suite with en suite dressing room and bathroom, plus a sixth or staff bedroom at lower ground level with en suite shower room. There are three large reception rooms, a roof terrace,

balcony, and off-street parking for two cars (by separate negotiation).

Nearby at No 46 is the notorious former home of Lord Lucan, still missing and the subject of bizarre sightings around the world. Let the authorities know if you see him walk past your front window.
